

CEBT's Covered Preventative Services For Adult Women July 1, 2011



Eligible charges for the items below will be covered at 100% through an in network provider. Through an out of network provider charges are subject to the plan deductible and coinsurance.

General Screening Guidelines
Alcohol Misuse screening and counseling
Anemia screening for pregnant women
Aspirin with prescription women aged 55 – 79
Bacteruria urinary tract and other infection screening – pregnant women
Breast Cancer Chemoprevention counseling higher risk
BRCA counseling about genetic testing for women at higher risk
Blood Pressure
Cervical Cancer screening
Chlamydia Infection screening for women at higher risk
Cholesterol Test (lipid profile-total cholesterol, LDL cholesterol, HDL cholesterol and triglycerides)
Clinical Breast Exam (by provider)
Colonoscopy (or alternative colorectal cancer screening test) over age 50
Depression screening
Diabetes Test (blood sugar level check)
Diabetes (Type 2) screening for adults with high blood pressure
Diet counseling for adults at higher risk of chronic disease
Folic Acid supplements
Gonorrhea screening for women at higher risk
Hepatitis B screening for pregnant women
HIV screening for adults at higher risk
Immunization vaccines for adults recommended

Mammogram (Breast Cancer) 1 screening between the ages of 35–39; 1 every 2 years 40–49; 1 per calendar year age 50+
Obesity screening and counseling
Osteoporosis screening for women over age 60
Pelvic Exam / Pap Smear
Rh Incompatibility screening for pregnant women and follow up tests
Routine Vision routine vision exam
Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) prevention counseling
Syphilis screening for pregnant women or higher risk women
Tobacco Use screening and interventions for all women and expanded counseling for pregnant women

General Immunization / Vaccine
Hepatitis A
Hepatitis B
Human Papillomavirus (HPV) for women age 26 or younger, who have not completed the vaccine series. Note: not to be given during pregnancy.
Influenza
Measles
Meningococcal
Mumps
Pneumococcal (pneumonia) Vaccine
Rubella
Tetanus / Diphtheria (Td) or Tetanus / Diphtheria / Pertussis (Tdap)
Varicella (chicken pox)
Zoster (shingles) age 60 and over
